



#### WBUR Poll Survey of 504 Registered Voters in Massachusetts Field Dates: November 9-12, 2017

I'm going to read you the names of several people who are active in public affairs. After I read each one please tell me if you have a generally favorable or generally unfavorable view of the person. If you have never heard of the person or if you are undecided, please just say so. **READ FIRST NAME**. How about **READ NEXT NAME**?

**REPEAT QUESTION TEXT ONLY IF NECESSARY, PROBE IF RESPONDENT SAYS "DON'T KNOW".** Have you heard of **READ NAME** and are undecided about (him/her)? Or **PAUSE** have you never heard of (him/her)?

Would you support or oppose increasing the state's income tax on any income over one million dollars and using that money to pay for education and transportation? **PROBE**: And do you strongly (support/oppose) this measure, or just somewhat?

There may be a measure on the 2018 ballot dealing with taxes. Would you support or oppose reducing the Massachusetts state sales tax from 6.25 percent to 5 percent and creating a permanent sales tax holiday one weekend per year? **PROBE**: And do you strongly (support/oppose) this measure, or just somewhat?

There may be a measure on the 2018 ballot dealing with paid family leave. The proposed measure would allow workers in Massachusetts to take paid leave take paid leave for a new child, a family illness, or if a family member goes on active military service. Employers would pay a zero-point-six percent payroll tax to cover the cost. Would you support or oppose this measure? **PROBE**: And do you strongly (support/oppose) this idea, or just somewhat?

## About the Poll

These results are based on a survey of 503 Massachusetts registered voters. Live telephone interviews were conducted November 9-12, 2017 via both landline and cell phone using conventional registration based sampling procedures. The margin of sampling error is 4.4 percentage points with a 95 percent level of confidence. The poll was sponsored by WBUR, a National Public Radio station in the Boston area.
