

PAATHS (Providing Access to Addictions Treatment, Hope and Support) is a one-stop shop for anyone looking for information about, or access to, substance use treatment services. Staff at PAATHS are able to provide phone support, community support and walk-in services to individuals who are seeking immediate placement in a range of substance use treatment programs.

The following resources provide recovery services in Spanish.

Boston Public Health Commission:

- <u>Entre Familia</u>: 6 to 12-month residential substance use treatment program that provides bilingual/bicultural, gender-specific, substance use disorder treatment to pregnant and postpartum women and their children.
- <u>MOM's Project</u>: outpatient treatment program that provides recovery services (individual therapy, group therapy, and case management) for self-identified women who have substance use disorders.
- <u>Men's Health and Recovery</u>: outpatient treatment program that provides recovery services (individual therapy, group therapy, and case management) for self-identified men who have substance use disorders.
