



WBUR Massachusetts Poll Survey of 456 Massachusetts Democratic Primary Voters Field Dates: October 16-20, 2019

About the Poll

These results are based on a survey of 456 likely voters in the Massachusetts Democratic Presidential Primary. Live telephone interviews were conducted October 16-20, 2018 via both landline and cell phone using conventional registration based sampling procedures. The final data was weighted to known and estimated parameters on party registration, gender, age, race, county, and education. The margin of sampling error is 4.6 percentage points with a 95 percent level of confidence. The poll was sponsored by WBUR, a National Public Radio station in the Boston area.

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
