About the Poll

These results are based on a survey of 402 working registered nurses in Massachusetts who reported working on the coronavirus crisis. A list of registered nurses in the state was obtained from the Massachusetts Health Professions License Verification site. Phone numbers were added via commercial telephone matching services. Live telephone interviews were conducted April 30-May 2, 2020 via both landline and cell phone. Results were weighted to known population parameters for age, race, gender and region of the state obtained from "The <u>Massachusetts Health Professions Data Series: Registered Nurse 2014 Report</u>" as well as the database of nurses. The margin of sampling error is 4.9 percentage points with a 95 percent level of confidence. The poll was sponsored by WBUR, a National Public Radio station in the Boston area.
