AFFIDAVIT OF ANNELISE ARAUJO, ESQ.

I, Annelise M. Jatoba de Araujo do hereby swear and affirm:

- 1. I submit this affidavit in support of Kary Diaz Martinez. The following statements are based on my personal observation or knowledge, except for those statements made on information and belief, as to which I am informed and believe to be true.
- 2. I am a member in good standing of the Massachusetts bar and immigration counsel for an individual who I shall refer to as Jane Doe 3 to protect her privacy.
- 3. Jane Doe 3 is a derivative applicant on her family's member's I-914 Application for T Nonimmigrant Status. She has a final order of removal following the denial of her application for asylum and the dismissal of the appeal.
- 4. Pursuant to existing ICE policy at the time of the T Visa filing, ICE granted our request to pause her departure plan, pending the USCIS's adjudication of her T Visa application.

Jane Doe 3 has complied with all necessary check-ins and home visits since she has been under ISAP's supervision.

5. Jane Doe 3 received sudden notice from the Intensive Supervision Appearance

Program (ISAP) that she was to present herself at ISAP's office, located at 11 Ray Avenue in

Burlington, MA. She appeared at ISAP on June 3, 2025, but was turned away. She returned on

June 4, 2025 complying with their request and was subsequently detained.

6. She was held overnight at the ICE field office, located at 1000 District Avenue,

Burlington, MA on June 4, 2025 and upon information and belief, she remains there currently.

7. She was permitted to call her family and request necessary medication. Initially,

her family members went to the ICE office to deliver her medication, but the ICE officers refused

to accept it, stating only an attorney could deliver the medication. My associate emailed ICE to

confirm this policy but received no response. A friend of the family was later able to deliver the

medication, but did not see or speak with Jane Doe 3. Jane Doe 3's family has not had any contact

with her since this morning.
