I am working every day to learn from this experience and to ensure that nothing like this ever happens again. I will prove—through my actions and not just my words—that I am capable of positive change and worthy of the Court's trust.

Your Honor, I want to sincerely apologize to the Court, to anyone who was harmed by my actions, and to my family and community, who deserved better from me. I understand that the consequences of my choices are mine to bear, and I accept responsibility. I am truly sorry for the poor judgment I showed.

Thank you for taking the time to read my letter. I respect this Court and the laws of the United States, and I want to ensure that I will never stand in front of you or any other judge on the wrong side of the law ever again.
